We have released this statement in response to the Conflict Minerals issue addressed in Section 1052 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010.

CommAgility takes seriously allegations that Conflict Minerals mined in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and surrounding conflict areas, may be making their way into the supply chain and that the profits from this illegal mining may be fuelling human rights atrocities. Conflict Minerals are defined in the above Act as cassiterite, columbite-tantalite, gold, wolframite and three derivatives: tantalum, tin and tungsten.

CommAgility expects its suppliers to comply with the Electronic Industry Code of Conduct and only to source minerals from environmentally and socially responsible suppliers. In support of this, CommAgility expects its suppliers continuously to monitor both direct and indirect supply chains to avoid procurement of materials from conflict regions, and to be forthright in sharing compliance information with CommAgility.

CommAgility has received and has on file EICC templates and/or policy statements from the vast majority of its suppliers and is in the process of obtaining the rest. Developing a supply chain that is knowingly free of conflict minerals is an ongoing process, and CommAgility will be working diligently with its suppliers to take corresponding corrective action if necessary.
